PRESENT RESEARCH AREA

My current research is divided into two main areas: Voting Theory and Experimental (Behavioral) Economics.

The principal objective in the first area is to propose new voting procedures that are highly relevant from a practical point of view. The approach followed here is mainly axiomatic; that is, to study desirable properties (such as efficiency, incentive compatibility, and consistency conditions) of these new procedures in order to distinguish them from other possible mechanisms. One particular point of interest is the analysis of general classes of voting procedures that take Approval Voting, one of the most important voting procedures both in theory and practice, as a special case. Consequently, I suggest new voting rules that should be applied instead of Approval Voting once one of the basic properties underlying Approval Voting is violated.

The current research in the second area concentrates mainly on the experimental and theoretical analysis of social preferences (such as inequity aversion, reciprocity, and procedural justice) in situations where individuals have to communicate their private information to others, who, in turn, take payoff relevant actions (strategic information transmission). One particular point of interest is to analyze how individuals solve the tension between economic incentives for lying and normative social behavior (truth-telling as an imperative). Furthermore, it is aimed at studying the conditions under which uninformed traders are able to manipulate asset prices in thin financial markets and how individuals behave in sequential procurement auctions.
